- Read a book of poetry.
- Ask a library staff member for a book recommendation.
- Read a book about an event that really happened.
- Check out a book about an animal that lives in Teton County.
- Read a book about the mountains.
- Read a book outside.
- Read a biography.
- Read a book about someone who lives in another country.
- Ask your teacher to suggest a book they think you'll like and then read it.
- Ask your parent or guardian what their favorite book was when they were your age and then read it.
- Read a book whose title starts with the same letter as your first name.
- What career or job do you want to have when you grow up? Read a book about it.
- Read a book about your favorite season.
- Read a book that looks really cool!
- Pick a book shelf in the library and read the very first book on it.
- Read a book with a one-word title.
- Read a book you remember from when you were younger.
- Read a book about a state you've never visited.
- Read a book about someone who is different from you in some way.
- What is a movie you like? Find the book it's based on and read it!
- Read a book you've never heard of.
- Re-read a book you love.

Adult Activities

- Read a book that teaches you how to do or make something.
- Read a book that contains illustrations or photos.
- Read a long (<500 pages) book.
- Read a short book (<100 pages).
- Read a book that takes place outside the U.S.
- Read a book that won a literary award.
- Read a book from a genre you've never read before.
- Read a book by a #ownvoices author (books about underrepresented/marginalized people with whom the author shares the same identity, inspired by the author's own experiences and written from their own perspective).
- Read a book by a debut author (1st time being published).
- Read a biography or memoir.
- Read a book about nature.
- Read a book of poetry.
- Read a book from a library display.
- Read an adult non-fiction book.
- Read a book published within the last year.
- Read a book about a person who affects change in their community or the world.
- Read a book about or takes place during a major historical event.
- Read a book you found while browsing the library stacks.
- Read a book that has Love in the title or subtitle.
- Read a book from the NPR Books We Love list.
- Read a book you own, but haven't read OR were supposed to read for school or book club, but didn't.
- Read a fiction or non-fiction book about an adventure.
